The Liquor and Cannabis Board is currently investigating Freya Farm for the illegal use of pesticides. Based on information obtained in the course of the investigation, all marijuana, usable marijuana, marijuana concentrates, and marijuana-infused products located at the licensed premises have been placed on an administrative hold under WAC 314-55-210.

During the administrative hold, Freya Farm is prohibited from selling, giving away, transferring, transporting, or destroying marijuana, usable marijuana, marijuana concentrate, and marijuana infused product. Freya Farm may continue to cultivate and harvest marijuana.

The following items are subject to the provisions of the administrative hold listed above:

- Usable marijuana, marijuana concentrate, and marijuana-infused product created from Lots:
 - 6027 72697000 2088
 - 6027 7269 7000 2596
 - 6027 7269 7000 2590
- Marijuana plants, and the product therefrom, propagated from the following areas:
 - All product located within “Drying Room” on June 8, 2017.
 - All plants located within “Veg Room” on June 8, 2017.
 - All plants locate within rooms designated “D1, D2” on June 8, 2017.
 - All plants located within “Nurse Open Area” on June 8, 2017.

Following the investigation, the Liquor and Cannabis Board may lift the administrative hold, order the continuation of the administrative hold, or seek a final agency order for the destruction of the marijuana, usable marijuana, marijuana concentrate, and marijuana infused product.

Under WAC 314-55-225, a recall is required when circumstances exist that pose a risk to consumers. This includes evidence that pesticides not approved by the board are present on or in marijuana, usable marijuana, marijuana concentrates, or marijuana-infused products above the action levels prescribed by WAC 314-55-108.
